

COUNTY MANAGER'S RECOMMENDATION OR COMMENTS:				
SUMMARY OF INFORMATION:				
On November 30, 2017, the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners adopted a Resolution authorizing staff to apply for a \$25,000 grant for an additional year of funding through the Community Grants Program from the Winston-Salem Foundation to support the Stepping Up Process to End Recidivism (SUPER) Project. The SUPER Project focuses on women in the local jail with co-occurring mental illness and substance abuse/use issues.				
On January 31, 2018, Forsyth County received notification that the application was approved by the Winston-Salem Foundation. The intent of these funds is to provide participants with transitional housing, transportation assistance, and/or contractual services for additional peer support services. These service areas have been most difficult to address over the past 12 months. Processes for accessing the funds will need to be developed with the Finance Department to ensure a seamless process.				
These funds will be included in the FY 2018-2019 Budget to support the Stepping Up Initiative.

GRANT CONTRACT

All grants are made in accordance with current applicable laws and the Internal Revenue Code, as amended.

1. GRANT RESULTS REPORTING:

Grant Results Report: Prior to the end of the grant period, the Foundation will provide the grantee with a Grant Results Report to use to provide written information about the results of the grant and the progress made on the outcomes listed below. Initialing beside each outcome below indicates the grantee's commitment to work toward achieving these outcomes during the grant period:

Initial SUPER has worked with the County GIS department (MapForsyth) to develop baseline data to evaluate program success.

Initial SUPER has created partnerships with agencies to help with transitional housing for clients and as a result has assisted at least 25% of participants in attaining transitional housing.

c) SUPER has provided peer services to 75% of SUPER participants transitioning out of the County detention center.

Initial (a) SUPER has partnered with GreenTree Community Center to provide clients with peers to allow for the "warm" community hand off.

Date due: June 28, 2019

The Foundation may arrange site visits with the grantee to review funded project activities, current and past.

- 2. **EXPENDITURE OF GRANT FUNDS:** Grant funds provided may be spent only for the purpose stated above, which is approved by The Winston-Salem Foundation Committee. The funded project and its budget may be changed only with the Foundation's prior approval.
 - A. Funds will be disbursed to the grantee upon the Foundation's receipt of this signed agreement; a written request for payment; and, if indicated, the satisfactory compliance with any special conditions.
 - B. Any special conditions which apply to the grant should be met promptly. Adequate evidence of compliance with the conditions will be required before the Foundation releases funds.
 - C. Expenses may not be charged against the grant prior to or after the date of the grant period without prior approval of the Foundation.
 - D. The grantee is responsible for grant funds received and for maintaining adequate supporting records consistent with generally accepted accounting practices.
 - E. Equipment or property purchased with grant funds shall be the property of the grantee organization unless the purpose of the organization changes or it should go out of existence. In either case, the equipment or property reverts to the Foundation.
- 3. **REVERSION OF GRANT FUNDS:** The grantee will return to the Foundation any funds not spent by the close of the grant period.

Also, if the Foundation determines that the grantee has breached this agreement, the grant will be canceled and all funds will be promptly returned to the Foundation.

- 4. **COPYRIGHTS**: The Foundation desires the widest possible distribution of any reports, books, or articles resulting from the grant. The Foundation reserves the royalty-free license to use such publications.
- 5. **LIMIT OF COMMITMENT:** Unless otherwise stipulated in writing, the Foundation has no obligation to provide other or additional support to the grantee.
